

Cripps raises over £42K for Myeloma UK

Over its last financial year, Cripps has raised £42,883 for Myeloma UK.

Myeloma is a rare form of blood cancer for which there is currently no cure. The organisation is dedicated to ensuring that patients can access the right treatment at the right time, and to improving standards of treatment and care through research, education and awareness raising. Their ultimate goal is to find a cure.

Cripps' staff took part in a host of activities to raise the impressive amount. Fundraisers included bake offs, raffles and a 'Get Cripps to Tokyo' challenge, where teams competed to run, walk, swim or cycle the equivalent distance from Tunbridge Wells to Tokyo (8,150 miles).

Activities culminated with Gavin Tyler, managing partner, cycling 100 miles on Sunday in the RideLondon-Essex event, which raised just over £3,000. The grand total includes £20,000 of matched funding kindly contributed by the firm's partners.
