
SRA Diversity Results Summary 2023






Based on the 280 responses to the survey, 75% were female and almost 24% males, the balance preferred not to say.

Almost everyone surveyed identifies their gender to be the same sex they were registered at birth



There are a population of people who consider themselves to have a disability according to the definition in the Equality Act 2010, with 5.71% people saying 'yes' to this question

6.81% said their day-today activities are limited hecause of a health because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months





Over 85% of those surveyed are British, Welsh, Northern Irish, Scottish. With a small number of other ethnicities reported
